NOTE: Questions of the Week originated with a three-fold purpose. 1. They provide the Christian Educator an opportunity to send out a weekly email to parents that not only includes the Question of the Week, but can also provide information about the current WRM session and upcoming church calendar events. 2. Questions of the Week

Week 1: In the story that we're reading for this Sunday, Bartimaeus, who is blind, tells Jesus, "I want to see again!" What is something that you've done before that you would like to do again?

Week 2: In the story that we're reading for this Sunday, Bartimaeus is blind and so he can't really work like the other people. So the job that he does is one of begging. This means he asks people to give him very small amounts of money. What job do you want to have when you grow up?

Week 3: In the story that we're reading for this Sunday, Jesus asks Bartimaeus, "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus answers, "Teacher, I want to see again!" Now suppose Jesus is asking you, now, this question of, "What do you want me to do for you?" How would you answer?
