Written for April 6, 2025 Fifth Sunday in Lent Lectionary Year C

Scripture: John 12:1-8 [Summary: Giving Gifts To Jesus]

Supplies Needed: No supplies are needed.

ASK (a.k.a *The On-Ramp*)

· Good morning!

- Have you ever heard the word, "Messiah"?
- Can you tell me what you think that word means?
- Those are good guesses thank you for sharing your thoughts.
- Messiah (and the Greek version of the word, "Christ") means "the anointed."
- To anoint someone is to put oil, a lotion-like oil, on that person sometimes on their head and shoulders, sometimes on their hands and feet.
- In Jesus' time and place, the Israelites would anoint the person who was going to be the next king.
- Since Jesus is sometimes called the *Messiah*, can you tell me the story of when Jesus was actually anointed?
- That's right it happens in today's scripture story!

TELL (a.k.a. <u>The Freeway</u>)

- In today's scripture story, Mary took some perfume-like oil and poured it on Jesus' feet.
- She then cleaned his feet with the oil.
- It was a very thoughtful gift and was probably her way of saying thank you to Jesus after he had raised Lazarus, her brother, from the dead.
- Jesus was thankful for her gift and said it was good for her to do.

- Even though we see Jesus give so much to others in terms of healing, teaching, and forgiveness, we see far less of others giving gifts to Jesus.
- But that's exactly what we see in today's story. And what an important gift it was that Jesus received!

SHARE the Good News (a.k.a. *The Destination*)

- One of the reasons I like this story is because it reminds us that we you and me! can also give gifts to Jesus.
- Maybe that's not something you think about too much, but one of the best gifts I think we can give
 to Jesus is to learn from him based on the things he said and did, like...
 - ...paying attention to God in prayer in the same ways that Jesus did
 - · ...spending time together in worship like Jesus did
 - ...by learning and talking about the Bible stories like Jesus did (including the Bible stories we have of Jesus)
- As we give Jesus this gift of following him, then we receive a different gift.
- When we learn to do the same things as Jesus did, we are also learning to receive the same things
 Jesus received from God like God's love, power, and forgiveness.
- And as we learn to receive those gifts from God, we are better able to then share those gifts with others, in the same ways Jesus did.
- That's a lot of giving of gifts, isn't it!?
- And that's the good news for today. Let's pray.
 This is a repeat-after-me prayer.
