Fourth Sunday in Advent

Lectionary Year C

Scripture: [Luke 1:39-55](#) [**Summary:** *Mary Magnifies God*]

Supplies Needed: A magnifying glass or a printed picture of one (see last page of this file).

ASK (a.k.a. *The On-Ramp*)

- Good morning!
- I have a question for you. [*hold up magnifying glass*] Can you tell me what this is? (a magnifying glass)
- You're right, it *is* a magnifying glass! Can you tell me what a magnifying glass does? (If you look through it, it makes the thing you are looking at appear larger. Or, if you shine light through it, it focuses the light, making the light brighter and hotter)
- You're right again - a magnifying glass does both of those things! It helps make light brighter and hotter and it helps us see more of the thing we are looking at.

TELL (a.k.a. *The Freeway*)

- In today's Bible story, we hear Mary (soon-to-be mother of the not-yet-born-baby-Jesus) say that her soul *magnifies* God.
- In other words, Mary is saying that she's seeing certain things about God very very well.
- She then says what some of those things are that she's seeing about God.
 - She says she sees the mercy and strength that God offers.
 - She sees how God lifts up those, who, like herself, are feeling lowly.
 - She sees how God fills those who are hungry with good things.
- And guess what? By saying and sharing these things that she sees about God, she's helping to magnify God for the rest of us – she's helping us to see God better!

SHARE the Good News (a.k.a. *The Destination*)

- And she's not the only one who magnifies God for the rest of us.
- After Jesus is born and grows up, we see him do the same thing as his mom does in today's story – he speaks and acts in ways that help us better see who God is.
- As we listen to and read the stories of people who magnify God – like Jesus, his disciples, his mom (Mary), his cousin (John the Baptist), etc., then we are learning how to better see who God is
- And the better able our seeing of God is, the more we become like Mary in today's story – that we, then, become magnifiers of God by helping them see God better.
- That's the good news for today. Let's pray.
