Scripture: Mark 1:4-11 [Summary: Baptism Is Just The Beginning]

Supplies Needed: No supplies needed

ASK (a.k.a *The On-Ramp*)

Good morning!

- I have a question for you. What do you think you do more times during a whole week Do you wash your whole body (that is, taking a bath or shower) more or do you wash your hands more?
- Why do we wash our hands more often, do you think? [because hands get dirtier in a shorter amount of time; because it is easier / faster to wash our hands than our whole bodies]
- Those are good answers. But before we continue, let me be clear that our hands do not get dirty because we are using our hands incorrectly; instead, that's just how it works, right? When we use our hands, they just get dirty.
- But what would happen if we chose to never ever wash our hands? [We'd be more likely to get sick, right? And we'd be more likely to get others sick, too, don't you think?]
- So let's keep washing our hands, ok?

TELL (a.k.a. <u>The Freeway</u>)

- I ask about washing our hands vs our whole bodies because in today's scripture reading, Jesus is baptized and it is the only time he is baptized.
- The way that Jesus was baptized, it was like he took a really quick bath.
- And, it is one of the ways that Jesus chooses to pay attention to God.
- But in the following story (one that we didn't read today), Jesus finds himself in the wilderness where he has three chances (or temptations) to **not** pay attention to God

- In that story, we see how Jesus chose to pay attention to God in a different way than baptism by saying verses from the Bible as a way to keep his mind on God.
- And, in other stories, we see Jesus chooses to pray as a way to pay attention to God.
- In still other stories, we see how Jesus attends worship as a way to pay attention to God.
- These are the different ways that Jesus pays attention to God. Some of those ways are like washing our hands. Those ways happen quickly and often.
- And other ways are like taking a bath. Those ways happen less often, but take more time.

SHARE the Good News (a.k.a. *The Destination*)

- And guess what? We can choose to pay attention to God in the same ways that Jesus did.
- Jesus' baptism is the choice to keep making those smaller choices of how to pay attention to God each day.
- In fact, that's mostly what Jesus does during his ministry: He teaches his disciples how to pay attention to God in the same ways that he did.
- Then, as we learn to and choose to do those every day actions that help us pay attention to God,
 - then we will also be the (cleaned) hands and bodies that share God's healing, love, and words of hope with those around us in the same way that Jesus did.
- That's the good news for today.
- Let's pray. This is a repeat-after-me prayer.
