Scripture: Matthew 4:1-11 [Summary: The Temptation Story: Who's #1?]

Supplies Needed: No supplies needed.

ASK (a.k.a <u>The On-Ramp</u>)

- · Good morning.
- At a sports game, or maybe when someone just won at a board game, or maybe when someone
 got the best grade in school, have you ever heard the chant, "Who's number one?"
- Or maybe you've seen signs that say "Who's #1?"
- Have you ever heard that question?
- So...what do you think...Who IS #1?
- [who knows what the kids will say to this question; I recommend letting them answer without putting the mic in front of them, and just repeating what they say so that the congregation can hear, as it allows you to filter the more potentially embarrassing answers]

TELL (a.k.a. <u>The Freeway</u>)

- · Those were all very good answers. Thank you for sharing.
- I asked you that question because it is a question that is asked of Jesus in today's scripture story.
- We usually call the story we heard today, "The Temptation of Jesus."
- And in this case, the word "temptation" is a fancy word for "test."
- And the test we hear Jesus being asked, in three different ways is "Who is #1?"
 - Is food #1?
 - Is Jesus #1?
 - Is someone else #1?

• And all three times, Jesus says, "No, those things are not #1. God is #1."

SHARE the Good News (a.k.a. *The Destination*)

Because Jesus kept answering that God is #1, then Jesus passed the test.

By passing the test, Jesus learned that he was ready to go out and show and teach others why it is good to remember that God is #1.

When God is first in our lives, just like God was first in Jesus' life, then we are able to know and share God's love, healing and forgiveness with those who are around us even when lots of other things are happening – just like Jesus did.

- And that's the Good News for today.
- Let's pray. This is a repeat-after-me prayer.
