Fourth Sunday of Easter

Lectionary Year C

Scripture: [John 10:22-30](#) [**Summary:** *Jesus Glues Us To God*]

Supplies Needed: Two popsicle / craft sticks. A glue stick or a bottle of somewhat-quick drying glue.

ASK (a.k.a *The On-Ramp*)

- Good morning
- I'm hoping you can help me, here: Can you tell me how to glue these two popsicle sticks together?
 - Should I just put the glue on one end of a popsicle stick and then wave the stick around? [*Do those actions as you talk*]
 - Should I put the glue on one end and press the two popsicle sticks together on this other end that is opposite of the glue? [*Do those actions as you talk*]
- No? I shouldn't do either of those things? What should I do instead? [*listen to answers*]
- Ok, so you're telling me that I should put some glue on the end of one popsicle stick and press the other popsicle stick against the place where I just put the glue?
- [*say in a light tone*] And why should I listen to you? Are you the glue masters? Are you the all-knowing glue experts? [*wait for responses*]
- [*say sincerely*] Oh...it sounds like you've done this before and it worked?
- So maybe I should try what you've said and then I'll find out if what you said is correct or not, right?
- OK. Let me do that right now
 - [*put glue on one end of the popsicle stick and place the other popsicle stick on top of the glue.*]
 - [*Set the sticks to your side (or behind you) while you talk*]
- While we wait for the glue to dry, let's talk about today's scripture story.

TELL (a.k.a. *The Freeway*)

- In today's story, Jesus talks about how no one can separate him from his followers.
- And one of the reasons for this is because as Jesus teaches his disciples about God, the more the disciples learn to trust Jesus.
- At first, this may not make sense to us – which is why I had you teach me something this morning
- As you've taught me about gluing these popsicle sticks together, I've learned that you know what you are talking about and I should trust what you are telling me.
- The same thing happened with the disciples, the more they learned from Jesus, the more the disciples learned to trust Jesus.
- But if those disciples had never tried what Jesus said, then they'd probably not trust Jesus very much.
- We see this lack of trust with the Pharisees in today's story.
- Since the Pharisees never try what Jesus says about connecting with God, they don't learn to trust Jesus.

SHARE the Good News (a.k.a. *The Destination*)

- Talking about learning...
- ...let's see how those popsicles sticks are doing
- [*the glue should be tacky enough that if you turn the two sticks over, the one stick won't separate from the other one*]
- Look at that! The glue is working and the two popsicle sticks are now joined together – thanks to your help!
- And, just like the glue helps these two popsicle sticks connect with each other, so too does Jesus help us connect with God.
- As we learn how to glue ourselves to God with Jesus' help, we learn to trust Jesus and we get to know God better.
- And that's the good news for today. Let's pray. This is a repeat-after-me prayer.
