QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

NOTE: Questions of the Week originated with a three-fold purpose. 1. They provide the Christian Educator an opportunity to send out a weekly email to parents that not only includes the Question of the Week, but can also provide information about the current WRM session and upcoming church calendar events. 2. Questions of the Week bring Sunday morning into the middle of the week (I usually send the Question of the Week email on Wednesday) by encouraging parents and their children to talk about the current WRM story. 3. To begin each class with the Question of the Week allows the students, teacher and shepherd an opportunity to get to know each other and provides a low-stress way to practice sharing.

Questions of the Week

Week 1: In the story that we're reading this Sunday, Nicodemus, a Pharisee, is curious about Jesus, so he goes to talk to him. What's something that you are curious about and would like to know more about?

Week 2: In the story that we're reading this Sunday, Jesus tells Nicodemus that the Holy Spirit is like the wind and that we are to let it move us. What's your favorite thing about the wind?

Week 3: In the story that we're reading this Sunday, Jesus tells Nicodemus that in order to pay attention to God in the same way Jesus does, Nicodemus has to start over (be born again). Can you think of something that you've had to start over with and re-do? What was it? Did you do better the next time?
