QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

NOTE: Questions of the Week originated with a three-fold purpose. 1. They provide the Christian Educator an opportunity to send out a weekly email to parents that not only includes the Question of the Week, but can also provide information about the current WRM session and upcoming church calendar events. 2. Questions of the Week bring Sunday morning into the middle of the week (I usually send the Question of the Week email on Wednesday) by encouraging parents and their children to talk about the current WRM story. 3. To begin each class with the Question of the Week allows the students, teacher and shepherd an opportunity to get to know each other and provides a low-stress way to practice sharing.

Questions of the Week

Week 1: In part of the story that we're reading this Sunday, the Pharisees make up accusations against Jesus. To accuse means to blame someone for doing something wrong. Have you ever been accused of something that you didn't do? If so, what happened? Were you able to show that you were innocent/didn't do it?

Week 2: The Pharisees in the story that we're reading this Sunday want something so bad that they are willing to do ANYTHING to get what they want. Was there something recently that you wanted really badly and thought that you would be willing to do ANYTHING in order to get it?

Week 3: In part of the story that we're reading this Sunday, the governor's wife writes a note to her husband telling him that she thinks Jesus is innocent. Have you ever received a note or a letter? Who wrote it to you? What did it say?
